

PRIORITIES IN ACTION

Led by the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, the Medical College of Wisconsin and Royal Capital, the ThriveOn Collaboration invests in the health, educational, social and economic wellness of Milwaukee's Bronzeville community and beyond.

Anchoring this generational commitment is the historic ThriveOn King development, a former department store transformed into a catalytic community hub and new home to the Foundation's offices. In addition to housing key partners, including numerous MCW community engagement programs, a Malaika Early Learning Center campus, JobsWork MKE and Versiti Blood Center of Wisconsin programs, ThriveOn King provides unprecedented spaces for the community to connect and thrive while honoring community heritage and culture. The development will also include approximately 90 units of mixed-income housing for families, seniors and medical students.

The vision for the ThriveOn Collaboration emerged through our deep engagement with community partners and neighborhood residents as a means of addressing longstanding disparities perpetuated by systemic racism and disinvestment. Milwaukee philanthropists stepped up to make it a reality:

- Contributing over \$8.7 million to bring the ThriveOn Collaboration to life
- Establishing the Milwaukee Community Chair in Health Equity Research
- Funding over \$1 million and counting in ThriveOn Small Business Loans to sustain and grow businesses along the King Drive corridor

With the support of Greater Together, the ThriveOn Collaboration will be a source of strength and connection for Milwaukee's historic Bronzeville district for the next generation.

"By walking alongside community and investing in a vision we've created together, the ThriveOn Collaboration is already having a catalytic effect in Bronzeville. Every facet of this work is historic, including the generosity of donors who aligned their giving to support neighborhood priorities and the development of ThriveOn King as an innovative community hub."

When Jim Schleif and Bill Morley saw the opportunity to contribute to true, systemic change through the Greater Together Campaign, the couple were determined to be part of the solution.

"The campaign tackled Milwaukee's greatest weakness boldly and head on: racial inequity and division," said Jim, who joined the Foundation Board this year. "We are so proud to play a small role in beginning to heal our community and open up spaces and access for more diverse voices to lead. We also felt heard and supported as we shared our own story as members of the LGBT community while locking arms with allies to create a community where we all will thrive."

The Foundation's role supporting people affected by HIV and AIDS at a time of heightened stigma and little hope left a large impression on Jim and Bill. Through the years, they built a lasting relationship with the Foundation that includes a legacy promise and their donor advised fund dedicated to advancing human rights, conservation and the alleviation of poverty.

"The Foundation has enormous reach," Jim said. "Focusing on community priorities alongside the Foundation, coupled with learning how to walk in other people's shoes, has led to great personal growth for both of us."

The United Community Center (UCC) launched its second agency endowment with the Foundation in 2023, building on a longstanding partnership in both philanthropy and philosophy that dates back decades.

"We see the Foundation as a partner in the truest sense because it has always brought us into different types of groups and conversations related to the work of creating a thriving community here in Milwaukee," said Laura Gutiérrez, CEO of UCC.

The Greater Milwaukee Foundation's strategic vision is a natural fit with the place-based leadership UCC has been providing for Milwaukee's Hispanic community since the early 1970s.

"Creating a Milwaukee for all calls us to provide the resources and educational platforms to make sure that everybody can unleash their potential and accomplish their goals," Gutiérrez said.

From a personal standpoint, ThriveOn, early childhood education and impact investing are areas my wife and I have focused on most. EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE & EDUCATION

For a visionary donor looking to invest in the future of Milwaukee, it is hard to imagine a better focus than early childhood care and education (ECE). Participation in quality ECE programs not only improves school and life outcomes for children, but also makes it possible for parents—especially mothers—to participate in the workforce and build economic mobility.

Yet, as Foundation-funded research has shown, Milwaukee struggles with a broken ECE market that leaves half of all children under 6 without access to quality programs and also fails to provide sustainable careers for ECE professionals.

This is why the Foundation elevated ECE as a core priority of the *Greater Together* Campaign, in partnership with Milwaukee Succeeds and a coalition of other stakeholders.

Through this campaign, donors stepped up with visionary contributions that allowed the Foundation to:

- Invest over \$2.6 million in a communitywide early childhood care and education strategy alongside Milwaukee Succeeds
- Provide direct support for quality ECE centers including the Malaika Early Learning Center (at the heart of the ThriveOn King development) and Ricardo Diaz Early Learning Academy
- Support coalition partners to secure additional millions in city, state, and federal funds for new initiatives to strengthen the early education workforce

These regionwide and systemwide investments show the power of philanthropy to build a stronger early childhood system for all.

"Philanthropic support from Foundation donors has been vital to our success leveraging additional private funding and advocating for public investment in early childhood education. With these resources, Milwaukee Succeeds and our coalition partners are improving the trajectory for our community's youngest learners and the systems that support them."

A Milwaukee for All needs all of us. Through *Greater Together*, donors representing Milwaukee's deep diversity and heritage stepped forward with historic leadership for the benefit of all communities.

With racial equity and inclusion as the North Star of the Foundation's strategic plan and campaign vision, *Greater Together* sought to reimagine what philanthropy looks like and who participates. At every stage of the campaign, leaders from Milwaukee's leaders from Milwaukee's Black, Hispanic and Latino, and Asian American and Pacific Islander communities sharpened the Foundation's vision and strategic focus. We engaged communities and organizations as partners and experts, and together, made generational philanthropic investments in our shared future.

In Milwaukee and across the country, the work of engaging diverse donor communities is far from finished. We continue to forge partnerships, welcome fresh perspectives, and bring the spotlight to communities and issues historically excluded from philanthropic support. Through the leadership of *Greater Together's* donors of color, philanthropy in Milwaukee will never look the same—it will look more and more like our community.

This included producing three new publications celebrating AAPI, Black and Hispanic and Latino community leadership and gifts of time, talent, treasure, and ties; hosting a major event at ThriveOn King to convene Black philanthropists; and supporting and connecting with professional advisers through the Community Adviser & Ambassador Network.

As a part of this effort, donors and communities of color contributed

Through *Greater Together*, Milwaukee donors didn't just give at historic levels—they helped advance new and innovative ways of investing in people, neighborhoods and enterprises across Milwaukee.

Nothing better represents this than the Foundation's impact investing program, which provides access to capital through donor-supported loans and equity investments that create economic opportunity while delivering a financial return that can be re-invested into new projects.

Because of its unique structure, impact investing targets places where other investors and lenders have not stepped up, and it multiplies its impact over many cycles of investment.

Through Greater Together:

- Donors contributed over \$3.2 million, which the Foundation supplemented with \$15 million of its own resources to mobilize over \$18 million in impact investments
- The Foundation has committed to 34 impact investments, which are on their way to delivering both social impact and financial returns
- Milwaukee entrepreneurs and small businesses across disinvested communities have sustained and grown their businesses—creating and retaining 412 jobs and counting

By demonstrating the power and scalability of impact investing, donors to *Greater Together* have helped pioneer a new way to make a difference across our community that will continue far beyond this campaign.

"Sometimes on paper, using conventional models to evaluate financial feasibility, it looks challenging to provide capital in the form of direct investments in our communities. This work will always be about what is possible when we move away from incremental change and have the vision and courage to transform our communities through direct investments. Despite the perceived challenges, this work is critical and provides the spark needed to move our communities forward."

For Jan and Paul Schueller, philanthropy is a way to remove barriers and cultivate opportunity. In thoughtful collaboration with their three children, Jan and Paul have been developing their philanthropic strategy since they created their first fund in 1998, ultimately selecting early childhood education and workforce development as two of their top focus areas.

"For us, it's about leveling the playing field," Paul said. "Early childhood education gives children a fair chance; workforce development creates opportunities for people who might otherwise be excluded."

The Schuellers considered starting their own standalone foundation, but close alignment with the *Greater Together* Campaign's priorities led them to make a legacy commitment with the Greater Milwaukee Foundation instead. They saw it as a natural continuation of their approach to philanthropy.

"As a family, we just want to use our time and resources to do what any decent human being would do: open some doors for others," Jan said.

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"As a community bank, we have resources we can bring to the market and into the community, into neighborhoods, but we don't always have the deep connections and partnerships to identify the opportunities. Through organizations like the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, we can support economic development, access to quality education, housing and homeownership – all those aspects that make a community stronger and improve quality of life, which helps our customers and ultimately helps our bank, but it's also the right thing to do."

PRIORITIES IN ACTION

For years, the Greater Milwaukee Foundation and its partners in the Community Development Alliance have been working to address one of our community's deepest challenges: ensuring safe, affordable, dignified housing for all.

The *Greater Together* Campaign represented a chance to mobilize our community around this vision on a new level. It inspired new investment in innovative strategies to increase stability and affordability for renters and bring homeownership within reach to build housing security and wealth in Black and Brown communities.

With support from our community through *Greater Together*:

- Donors have invested over \$1 million to advance the Community Development Alliance's comprehensive housing strategy
- The Community Development Alliance has invested in new models for affordable housing, created a new homeownership acquisition and education program to build wealth and fight displacement, and launched a new pipeline program to increase the diversity of the property appraisal workforce
- The Foundation and Community Development Alliance have earned national recognition, winning the 2023 HUD Secretary's Award for Public-Philanthropic Partnerships

These recent outcomes show how private philanthropic support paired with collaborative, communitywide strategies can impact a complex and deeply rooted challenge like housing—and we're just getting started.

\$2M Target for continued investment

Some of the most visionary philanthropic investments in Milwaukee's future are the most open-ended: flexible funds.

These are the donor investments that have enabled the Greater Milwaukee Foundation to respond to our community's changing needs for over a century—whether that meant funding tuberculosis treatment and orphanages in the early 20th century or mobilizing resources to support our community through the COVID-19 pandemic.

Through *Greater Together*, donors stepped up with gifts that empower the Foundation to respond to emerging and immediate needs as well as invest in the deeper systemic changes that shape our community's future:

- Donors invested over \$20 million in flexible funding through this campaign.
- The Foundation used \$500K in flexible funds to seed the MKE Responds Fund, which raised over \$5.7M for relief and recovery during the COVID-19 pandemic. Grants provided immediate support in areas including food, housing, health care, early childhood, and education.
- In 2022, flexible funds helped MKE Responds pivot to invest in violence prevention programs at the neighborhood level.

While we can't predict the future, we can preserve its promise. The foresight of donors supporting flexible funds through *Greater Together* combined with the expertise of our community partners ensures that the Foundation will have the resources and insight to meet our region's changing needs—today and tomorrow.
